



The elected board of ADI

The elected board is the volunteer governing board of ADI, responsible for the property and business of ADI. Each year there are vacancies, and people are nominated by an ADI member country. All member countries then vote. People with dementia can be nominated, and up to two positions are available for people with dementia on the Board.

The Chairman also has the option of co-opting a person with dementia to serve on the Board from time to time. This may be necessary for the forthcoming Board meeting in London in about April next year and in Berlin in October next year, as currently; there is no person with dementia on the elected board.

Elected members of the board serve for three years and may be re elected for one further three year term (in any one role) serving a maximum of six years.

For the between Conference Board meeting (if scheduled), economy fares and accommodation at the meeting venue in London are provided by ADI. Attendance at the Board meeting held immediately before the Conference, and the Conference itself, are the responsibility of members themselves.
